Cowichan Women Against Violence 101 Community Heros Campaign

The 101 Community Heroes Campaign is a grassroots donor drive aimed at helping ensure the survival of Charolotte's Place Women's Shelter, run by Cowichan Women Against Violence Society (CWAV). Charlotte's Place is a 24-hour, low-barrier shelter for women and women-identifying individuals who are experiencing homelessness. CWAV is seeking 101 individuals to become monthly donors at \$20 a month, with all proceeds going directly into the operational support of the shelter. A donation to this campaign ensures safety, shelter, access to community supports, and a lifeline to new possibilities for some of the most vulnerable members of the Cowichan community.
