Your Thoughts on Vaping Regulatory Framework

Good Day,

On November 14, 2019, the Minister of Health announced the intention to strengthen the current regulatory framework to address the rise in youth vaping. The Ministry of Health (the Ministry) is proposing new regulations under the *Tobacco and Vapour Products Control Act* and the *Public Health Act* to be enacted on April 1, 2020.

As part of the process to develop the regulatory framework, the Ministry is seeking comments on the proposed regulatory changes outlined in the *Vapour Products Intentions Paper*. You can view it at: https://www2.gov.bc.ca/gov/content/vaping.
