

Food Banks Canada's <u>HungerCount2018 Report</u> includes powerful recommendations to governments including a call to <u>Support the Creation of Standardized</u>, <u>Affordable Early Learning and Childcare Across the Country</u>. Read the full report and four public policy recommendations that would decrease Canadians' reliance on food banks. In BC, 31% of food bank users were families with children, including 39,510 children in the most recent count.

Call for Applications – 2019 Community Child Car Seat Program

Once again, BCAA and United Way of the Lower Mainland are working in partnership to make child car seats available to non-profit community agencies/programs through the Community Child Car Seat Program.

Who can apply?

Community programs that:

- operate under a registered non-profit agency
- support families with children under the age of nine
- work with families who do not have the resources to purchase a child car seat
- transport children under 9 years as part of their program
- operate a child seat loaner program

Successful applicants will receive child car seats at no cost for use within their program and/or for distribution to families in need.


