North Cowichan Citizen Satisfaction Survey

North Cowichan is launching its second Citizen Satisfaction Survey and invites residents to share their feedback!

Through telephone interviews conducted by Forum Research Inc., randomly selected residents will be asked for their input on a variety of topics such as satisfaction with the services provided by the Municipality, quality of life, and value for taxes. The survey will run from June 22 to July 8.

Phones will display 877-453-0539 as the incoming number

Residents who do not receive a call to complete the randomly selected telephone survey can still participate and share their feedback through an online version of the survey, which is open for input until July 8.

The results of the 2022 Citizen Satisfaction Survey will be compared against the baseline 2019 Citizen
Satisfaction Survey(External link), and Council and staff will use this information to identify improvements and determine priorities. Results will be made available later this summer.

All information collected through the survey will remain confidential, individual responses will not be shared, and results will be provided in an aggregate form only.

Public Hearing for North Cowichan OCP


North Cowichan has scheduled the public hearing for the Official Community Plan (OCP) to take place July 18 and July 19.

This is your chance to tell your elected Council whether you support the direction of the new OCP, a visionary plan that will determine how the Municipality responds to the big issues facing North Cowichan – whether that's managing future growth and development, protecting and restoring sensitive environmental areas, mitigating and adapting to climate change, increasing the supply of affordable housing, promoting agriculture and food security, or supporting local economic development.

You can participate in the public hearing electronically or in-person:

- Monday, July 18 at 2:00 pm until at least 6:00 pm (<u>electronically</u>).
- Tuesday, July 19 at 2:00 pm until at least 6:00 pm (in-person at Cowichan Exhibition Park, 7380 Trans-Canada Highway).

Who shows up at the public hearing will play a major role in determining whether Council adopts the new OCP, which in turn will chart the course for North Cowichan and the larger Cowichan region for the next 20 years and beyond.

Anyone unable to attend the public hearing and wishing to provide a written submission on the new OCP is encouraged to write to: publicmeetings@northcowichan.ca.

The draft OCP is based on extensive public engagement over the past three years, including broad surveys, online webinars and input from a citizen advisory committee and neighbourhood ambassador teams, with more than 1,200 residents and organizations participating. This public feedback helped the Municipality establish a common vision and goals, determine a growth management strategy, and obtain input on an initial draft of the OCP.
