We also have a "take and bake" option which would work great for a zoom meeting or staff party with everyone being able to pick up their meals from one location prior to the event.

Unbelievable Rebates! What a great time to replace fossil fuel (and baseboard and woodstove home heating appliances) for heat pumps! Let's make our valley more climate and air quality "friendly".

CVRD offers a \$2,000 incentive for replacing woodstoves with a heat pump

Until Dec 31, residents can: access <u>double the rebates</u> on select upgrades for home energy improvements through the CleanBC Better Homes and Home Renovation Rebate Programs when they register for a promo code by December 31 2020 and complete eligible upgrades by March 31 2021. Applies to baseboard and fossil fuel systems.

Work together with one ore more homes, and get more money: Additional rebate offer that rewards groups of homeowners working together to reduce greenhouse gas emissions by switching from an oil, natural gas, or propane heating system to an air source heat pump.


Saturday, November 14th, 9:30 - 12:00 noon Pacific Standard Time, on Zoom.
