Demystifying the Mental Health Act Webinar

BC Mental Health and Substance Use Services has launched a Concurrent Disorders Webinar series that might be of interest to people.

The next webinar will be on **Demystifying the Mental Health Act** and takes place via Zoom on **Tuesday**, **February 22nd**, **12:30-2:00 p.m. PST.** The panelists are Dr. Vijay Seethapathy (psychiatrist and Chief Medical Officer at <u>BCMHSUS</u>), Kendra Milne (lawyer and Executive Director at <u>Health Justice</u>), and it will be hosted by Victoria Maxwell, a person with lived experience of being certified under the Act. This will provide a clinical, legal, and lived experience perspective of the complex Act.

Demystifying the Mental Health Act: On February 22nd, 12:30-2:00pm, BC Mental Health and Substance Use Services is hosting a webinar to deepen our understanding of the Mental Health Act, which allows healthcare providers to involuntarily admit and treat people with serious mental health issues who pose a risk to themselves and/or others. This is an opportunity to unpack and understand how the Mental Health Act is applied from medical, legal, and lived experience perspectives.

About the <u>Concurrent Disorders Webinar Series</u>: This is a quarterly event designed for patients and families, by patients and families. It is a welcoming space for all patients and families interested in learning about topics related to complex and concurrent mental health and substance use disorders.

About <u>BC Mental Health and Substance Use Services</u>: We provide highly-specialized care to people with severe mental health and substance use (MHSU) disorders, people in custody, and people referred by court for mental health assessment or treatment across British Columbia.

All topics are determined by the people with lived experience on BCMHSUS's Health Literacy Working Group. Webinars will happen every three months and will focus on important topics, such as trauma-informed care, disrupting stigma in health care, pharmacology, and more. The first webinar on Trauma-informed Care in November 2021 was very well-received. The recording can be found here.
