Membership Overview

The Cowichan Communities Health Network is an open network and invites any citizen to participate. The CCHN strives to consist of a minimum of 25 members, with a cross-section of geographic, organizational, local government and citizen participants. A concerted effort is made to ensure diversity at the table.

To ensure broad regional representation, the CCHN endeavors to include a minimum of 4 members from central Cowichan communities, 3 from southern Cowichan communities, 2 from northern Cowichan communities, and 2 from western Cowichan communities.

The CCHN seeks participation from a wide range of groups, organizations, communities and citizens to inform its focus on the "determinants of health". Representation from each sector will be limited to 5 representatives until a balance of sector representation is established.

4. Southern Cowichan Communities:

Cobble Hill, Shawnigan Lake, Mill Bay, Malahat, Malahat FN.

Membership Term

Membership term is two years; with half renewing each year on January 1st; all terms are renewable, keeping diversity goals in mind.

Member Recruitment

Membership recruitment is ongoing as required to meet diversity goals. Members and prospective members will complete an application and commit to a two year term. All applications go to a selection committee that considers both current network make up and individual suitability. Membership recruitment is ongoing as required to meet diversity goals. Prospective members are encouraged to attend a minimum of 3 meetings prior to application.

Membership / Participation

The CCHN recognizes several different types of participation:

- 1. Members (regular attendance, participation in decision making)
- 2. Corresponding Liaisons (receive regular CCHN updates, share information, minimal participation in meetings, no participation in decision making).
- 3. Guests / community members/ prospective members

Membership Accountability

Members are expected to attend and fully participate in regular monthly CCHN meetings. Members may also be requested to participate in working groups and/or community events. Whenever possible, members will notify the Facilitator at least three days prior to any anticipated absence from a regular CCHN meeting. Members absent from two consecutive meetings without regrets will be contacted by one of the co-chairs. Members absent from three consecutive meetings without regrets are deemed to have vacated their seat, and an appropriate replacement will be recruited.
